# 'LAUNCH!' Client Heading to Wyoming for National Forest Internship

"LAUNCH! Your Success" participant Flinn, 19, is looking forward to his 18-week internship in the Shoshone National Forest. **Bordering Yellowstone National** Park in Wyoming, Shoshone National Forest is America's first national forest and is home to some of the greatest concentrations of grizzly bears in the lower 48 states. Flinn will be working on the Developed Recreation crew through the Student Conservation Association (SCA). He will be doing work such as cleaning fire rings, painting and repairing picnic tables, landscaping, cleaning restrooms, using hand tools, working with campground hosts, and interacting with the public about forest rules and regulations.

During his free time, Flinn will be able to enjoy the many recreation options including hiking, fly fishing, horseback riding, rafting, kayaking, rock climbing, and numerous other local events throughout the summer.

Shortly after starting 11th grade, Flinn dropped out of high school. He first met with LAUNCH! career advisor Brittany and HiSet instructor Cindy in August 2021. Flinn enrolled in the LAUNCH! program on January 28, 2022, and has passed four out of the five HiSet tests with college-level ready scores. He is currently preparing to take his last test before he leaves in the middle of May.

During his internship, Flinn will receive a travel allowance, a weekly living allowance, free housing, and will also be eligible for an AmeriCorps education award.

"I think the LAUNCH! program is a powerful tool to move people forward; the staff pushes you to do the work but understands the importance of pacing and environment.

"I want to get involved in the conservation of our lands because I have strong opinions on preservation and I believe it's very important that the right people are the ones working in the field."

# **Bradford County Action Success Story**



Emily was referred to Bradford County Action in March 2021 by a staff member at Lackawanna College in Towanda, PA. At the time, Emily was working long hours on a pig farm and decided she wanted to change her career path and attend the Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA) program. The Youth Career Advisor and the Adult/Dislocated Worker Case Manager met with Emily and determined that she was eligible for the Out of School Youth Program.

Emily began doing academic remediation with the instructors at Bradford County Action and

started her CCMA program in June 2021. She loved her classes and excelled in them. Emily's instructor stated that she was doing very well in the course.

In February 2022 Emily started clinicals and found them to be very hectic but rewarding. She also discovered that she really likes the phlebotomy field and hopes to find a job where she can use her medical assistance and phlebotomy training.

Emily passed the CCMA National Certification Exam in April 2022. Emily is expecting a baby in May 2022 and continues to work parttime at a local hospital.

# NTRPDC Increases 'STEAM' Opportunities in the Northern Tier

In August 2021, the Northern Tier Regional Planning and Development Commission (NTRPDC) applied to the PA Department of Labor and Industry for funding to increase Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math (STEAM) opportunities for youth in the region. The aim was to provide new STEAM kits to all of the school districts in the five-county region, giving students increased and new opportunities.

With the grant award, NTRPDC provided 15 school districts and the two YMCAs within our region with new STEAM activities to be used either this school year, over the summer, or next school year. Some of the kits can be reused from year to year. The participating schools and YMCAs will report on how many youth were impacted by the new STEAM kits. The school districts and YMCAs were thankful for the opportunity to get new equipment and activities for students. So far, three districts have reported back this school year with articles on the use of the kits and pictures of groups of students involved. In just these three districts more than 200 kids in grades 4-8 were enriched by the materials.

### **Sullivan County Success Story**

Gerhett enrolled in the "Launch! Your Success" program in January 2022 in hopes of finding fulfilling full-time employment. Gerhett is a recent Sullivan County High School graduate who aspired to stay and work in Sullivan County. Staff at Sullivan County Trehab connected him with an exciting on-the-job training opportunity at a new company setting roots in Sullivan County. Unity Lab recently purchased the Hoffman New Yorker in Dushore, PA, and is revitalizing the current operation and bringing new industry to the county with the addition of Unity Laundry. Unity Laundry supplies washing machines to clients across the United States. They also plan

to continue Hoffman's steam press manufacturing.

Gerhett completed an eight-week on-the-job (OJT) training as a quality control technician with Unity Laundry. As part of the quality control team, Gerhett learned how to quality test the commercial washing machines and prepare them for customer shipment. Gerhett will be working full time with plenty of room for advancement as the company grows. George from Unity commented, "Gerhett has been a valuable addition to the team. He is a quick learner, and he has a great work ethic. He is certainly an OJT success story." Gerhett is excited to continue his career with Unity Lab and staff at Sullivan County Trehab wish him continued success.

Building relationships and trust is important in forming successful and positive experiences for our clients. The overwhelming feedback from the community has been positive and inspiring. As we move into a new era post-pandemic, I hope to continue to connect the youth of our community with the tools and resources they need to excel, and to remind them that they're not alone."

High School Equivalency certificate and on becoming a new mother.



#### **Remake Learning Days**

## Northern Tier BEP Returns to Pre-Pandemic Activities

The Northern Tier Regional Planning and Development Commission's (NTRPDC's) Business Education Partnership (BEP) has been coordinating and implementing in-person career education events for students of the Northern Tier this school year. NTRPDC's BEP program employs career coaches to assist school districts with career education in the five-county region. The goal of the BEP is to increase career education and exploration events to students in K-12 in an effort to improve students' career awareness, soft skills, and workplace knowledge.

Students regularly participate in classroom lessons that include career education. Career coaches assist in implementing events such as mock interview days, career fairs, employer panels, and many others in an effort to directly link students to area businesses so

they can become aware of the range of occupations right here in the Northern Tier. The COVID-19 pandemic put on hold many of the in-person activities that previously connected students to employers. Career coaches had to become more innovative and they used online platforms to make connections where possible. This school year, in-person events are once again an option and career coaches have been busy planning and implementing as many events as possible.

The Bradford Sullivan Career Fair was held on March 18, 2022, at Towanda High School. Nearly 600 students from seven districts across Sullivan and Bradford counties attended the event. Students had access to representatives of 25 local businesses who were ready to talk about their jobs as well as hundreds of other types of occupations available within their companies. While at the event, students also participated in an "Essential Skills Scavenger Hunt" where they were given marks on a score card by the presenters depending on how effectively they interacted with presenters. If they displayed good "soft skills" during interactions, they had their score cards marked and could be entered to win a prize. Our thanks to all of the schools and businesses that participated as well as to Towanda High School for hosting.

Multiple mock interview days were held across the Northern Tier during January, February, and March 2022. During mock interviews, students meet with business professionals or school staff and are "interviewed" and then critiqued by the interviewer on how

well they did. These mock interviews are structured with possible questions given to the interviewer and interviewee before their meeting. Students are also prepared beforehand about soft skills as well as appropriate apparel. They also prepare resumes to be distributed to the interviewers before the interview takes place. These "mock interviews" give students a unique opportunity to prepare for real interviews.

Career cluster panels were held on multiple dates at Wellsboro High School during February and March. Each panel consisted of multiple (four to eight) professionals who discussed their occupations. The career clusters represented were manufacturing, health sciences, entrepreneurship, hospitality and tourism, transportation and logistics, law and public safety, skilled trades, and agriculture. The panels gave students the opportunity to

speak directly to professionals in the field that they are interested in and ask specific questions about the skills, abilities, and education needed for specific occupations.

These are just a few of the career education activities that BEP's career coaches have conducted this school year. Students and employers alike have been happy to once again speak face to face.

## Healthy Minds, Thriving Kids Project Website

Some estimates suggest that as many as 20 percent of kids in the U.S. have a mental health, behavioral, or learning disorder. During the summer, students and their families can feel isolated from friends and support, which can make things even worse.

One online resource is the Healthy Minds website (https://childmind.org/healthyminds/) developed through a partnership between the State of California and the Child Mind Institute.

The website, available in both English and Spanish, provides videos for parents and other caregivers, educators, and students from elementary school through high school age. The video series addresses the following topics:

- Understanding Feelings: Students will learn that better understanding and recognizing their emotions can be an important first step toward healthy coping and deeper relationships.
- Relaxation Skills: Students will learn specific relaxation skills, such
  as paced breathing, that they can use when experiencing intense or
  uncomfortable emotions.
- Understanding Thoughts: Students will learn about connections between their thoughts, feelings, and behaviors and how they can change thinking patterns to make them more helpful.
- Managing Intense Emotions: Students will learn to recognize and manage intense emotions without giving in to the urge to act in impulsive ways that can make problems bigger.
- Mindfulness: Students will learn how paying attention to the present moment can increase self-awareness, improve decision-making, and make it easier to deal with uncomfortable emotions.

Each video comes with a brief companion resource that summarizes key ideas and includes an activity that can be practiced in school or at home.
